



Who's our role model?

"Indeed in the Messenger of Allah you have an excellent example to follow for whoever hopes in Allah and the Last Day and remembers Allah much." Qur'an 33:21

Muslims believe that Muhammad (s.a.w) is the final Prophet in a long chain of Prophets sent to call the people to the obedience and worship Allah alone. The Prophet's (s.a.w) wife, 'A'isha, was once asked to describe the Prophet (s.a.w), and she replied that "his character was a reflection of the Quran" (Adabul- Mufrad), meaning he meticulously implemented the noble teachings of the Qur'an into his daily life. We will demonstrate how he translated these noble teachings into noble actions.

Mission of Mercy

"And We (Allah) have not sent you (Muhammad) except as a mercy for mankind." Qur'an 21:107

As well as calling people to pray, fast and give charity, the Prophet (s.a.w) taught that one's faith in Allah should also affect one's treatment of others. He said:

"The best of you are they who have the best character."(Bukhari)

Many sayings of the Prophet (s.a.w) emphasise the relationship between belief and action. The final Messenger (S.a.w) also taught humans to show mercy and to respect each other: **"He who does not show mercy to others, will not be shown mercy."(Bukhari)**

Equality

"Indeed the most honoured of you in the sight of Allah is the most righteous of you." Qur'an 49:13

In the following sayings of the Prophet (s.a.w), he taught that all humans are equal in the sight of Allah:

"O People verily your lord is one and your father (Adam) is one. There is no superiority for an Arab over a non-Arab, nor for a black over a white; except through piety."(Musnad Ahmed)

"Allah does not judge you according to your appearance and your wealth, but He looks at your hearts and looks into your deeds." (Muslim)

Tolerance

“Good deeds and evil deeds are not equal. Repel evil with what is best, then he with whom you had enmity shall become as a loyal friend.” Qur’an 41:34

“You should not do evil to those who do evil to you, but you should deal with them with forgiveness and kindness.” This is how the final Messenger of Allah (s.a.w) reacted to personal attacks and abuse.

Islamic sources include a number of instances where the Prophet (s.a.w) had the opportunity to take revenge upon those who wronged him, but refrained from doing so.

Gentleness

“By the grace of Allah, you are gentle towards the people; if you had been harsh and hard-hearted, they would have dispersed from around you.” Qur’an 3:159

On one occasion, the wife of the Prophet (s.a.w) reacted angrily after being insulted by a person.

The Prophet (s.a.w) advised her: “Be gentle and calm, O ‘Aisha, as Allah likes gentleness in all affairs.” (Muslim)

He also said: “Show gentleness! For if gentleness is found in something, it beautifies it, and when it is taken out from anything, it makes it deficient.” (Muslim)

Humbleness

“And the servants of The Most Gracious (Allah) are those who walk on the earth in humbleness, and when the ignorant address them, they say: ‘Peace.’ ” Qur’an 25:63

The Prophet (s.a.w) used to prevent people from standing up for him out of respect. He used to sit wherever there was a place available in an assembly and never sought a prominent or elevated place. He never wore anything to distinguish himself from his companions or appear in higher rank than them. He used to mix with the poor and the needy; he used to sit with the elderly and support the widows. People who did not know him could not tell him apart from the rest of the crowd.

The Ideal Example

“Indeed you (O Muhammad) are on an exalted standard of character.” Qur’an 68:4
What has preceded is only a glimpse of how Muhammad (s.a.w) lived his life. The examples of kindness and mercy mentioned may come as a surprise to some people given the portrayal of Islam in the media and its constant misrepresentation.

We should all make it a point to study and read about the Seerah of our beloved messenger Muhammad (s.a.w) to truly appreciate his teachings and Sunnah.

A perfect role-model for all

- If you are rich then there is a model for you in the trader of Makkah.
- If you are poor then there is a model for you in the one exiled to the valley of Abu Taalib and the migrant to Madinah.
- If you are a king there is a model for you in the ruler of Arabia.
- If you are a conqueror there is a model for you in the victor of Badr and Hunayn.
- If you have suffered defeat there is a model for you in the one troubled at Uhud.
- If you are a teacher there is a model for you in the teacher of Suffah.
